REPORT:

The College has the need to contract with a qualified firm to provide comprehensive hazardous waste disposal and related consulting services on an "as needed" basis.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) for Hazardous Waste Disposal and Consultation Services was issued and advertised in the Daily Journal of Commerce, and the State of Oregon VIP system on February 26, 2001. Copies of the RFP documents were distributed to twenty-seven (27) firms, four (4) of which were certified M/W/ESB firms. A total of five (5) proposals were received in response to the RFP. Proposals were reviewed and rated by the evaluation committee members based on the following criteria: Background, Experience and Qualifications; Compliance Programs; Pricing and Documentation Information; Work Plan and Approach; and References.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Directors accept the evaluation committee's recommendation and award a contract to Enviro-Comp Services, Inc. to provide Hazardous Waste Disposal and Consultation Services. The total annual expenditure for these services is estimated at \$35,000. The initial contract period will commence June 1, 2001 and end June 30, 2002 subject to renewal on an annual basis, beginning July 1st of each year, through June 30, 2006. Expenditures for this work will come from the general fund.

Resolutions 01-081-085, 01-087, 01-089, 01-090, and 01-092 were moved for approval by consent agenda by Director Anderson; it passed unanimously.
