REPORT:

At the October 18, 2001 meeting, per Resolution #02-037, the Board adopted findings, granted an exemption from competitive bidding, and authorized the use of the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) alternative contracting method for the Southeast Center Construction Project. The project will be the development of a new center site to be located at 2315 SW 82nd Avenue, encompassing a 12,240 square foot addition to the existing building, a new two-story 26,658 square foot wing addition, plus the renovation of an existing 59,200 square foot onestory structure. The direct costs of the project are estimated to be approximately \$12,000,000.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) for a CM/GC for this project was issued and advertised in the Daily Journal of Commerce on February 1, 2002. RFP documents were sent to eighteen (18) contractors and four (4) plan centers. Nine (9) proposals were received for consideration by the due date of February 22, 2002. The proposals were then reviewed and scored, based on the evaluation criteria listed in the RFP, by a selection committee comprised of College staff and the project architect. The top five (5) scoring contractors were interviewed by the selection committee on March 22, 2002.

Note: Extensive outreach was done to MWESB general contractors for this project, particularly through OAME. However, none of the eighteen (18) contractors that requested copies of the RFP are certified MWESB firms.

There do not appear to be any certified MWESB firms that are qualified to do CM/GC projects at this time. There are many certified MWESB contractors that will be contacted and asked to bid on the sub-contract work for this project. Significant efforts will be made by the selected CM/GC to involve as many MWESB contractors in as much sub-contract work as possible.

Upon completion of the evaluation process as prescribed in the RFP, the selection committee recommends awarding this CM/GC contract to the highest final scoring contractor, Baugh Construction. Baugh Construction brings the knowledge, experience and commitment to complete this project on time and within budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Directors accept the proposal from, and award the CM/GC contract for the Southeast Center Construction Project to Baugh Construction Company.

The actual total construction cost will be based on a negotiated Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP), which will be brought back to the Board for expenditure approval authority.

Director Anderson moved to approve Resolutions 02-084 through 02-094 and it passed unanimously.
