REPORT:

The Associate of Applied Science in Dealer Service
Technology will prepare students to become qualified
Caterpillar service technicians. Students will learn technical
skills that will enable them to work on Caterpillar equipment
such as agricultural, construction, forestry, and earthmoving
equipment. The program combines technical and academic
education with real world experience through a four-term
paid internship sponsored by Caterpillar dealerships. The
internships will give students the opportunity to experience
possible future careers. Areas of instruction include engine
fundamentals, machine hydraulics, fuel systems, electrical
systems, transmissions and torque converters,
undercarriage systems and final drives in addition to general
education.

The program was developed in partnership with the Caterpillar Corporation. Portland Community College was selected by the corporation to be the only community college offering this program within a six state region. There is currently no other program of its kind in the Northwest. The proposed program is the result of a nationwide effort by a major industry to increase the educational level of the workforce, both regionally and nationally. The program ties directly to the Oregon and Pacific Northwest's economic workforce goals. Continuous program improvement will include input from the Caterpillar Corporation and the PCC external advisory board.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the college be authorized to submit an application to the State Board of Education for an AAS degree in Dealer Service Technology.
