REPORT: The proposed Associate of Applied Science degree in
Automotive Service Technology: Automotive Service
Education Program will prepare individuals to service
General Motors cars and light trucks. The degree was

(ASEP) students must be sponsored by a GM Dealer or
an authorized ACDelco Service Center.
