ACCEPT PROPOSAL AND AWARD CONTRACTS FOR LAND SURVEYING SERVICES

REPORT:

With passage of the 2008 bond measure, the College has the need to contract with qualified firms to provide land surveying services for projects initiated by the College. These general land survey tasks shall be in accordance with industry accepted standards and practices as well as the requirements of the local governing jurisdiction. Survey services shall include but are not limited to: obtaining information for site development plans, boundary surveys for land acquisition, environmental assessments and capital project construction sites.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) for these services was issued and made available to all interested firms on October 19, 2010. The RFP was advertised in the Daily Journal of Commerce, on the State of Oregon Procurement Network (ORPIN), and on the PCC Solicitation website. A total of forty two (42) entities, which included architects, engineers, consultants, plan centers, and other interested parties (sixteen (16) of which indicated they were MWESB firms) registered and downloaded a copy of the RFP document.

A total of nineteen (19) proposals were received in response to the RFP. Written Proposals were reviewed and rated by a Bond Program evaluation committee. Members of this committee scored the proposals based on the following criteria: firm background, firm experience and success, administration of work, project

scheduling and coordination, fee and social responsibility.

Written proposal evaluation scores by the Bond Team were as follows:
