REPORT: On July 14, 2011 (BA 12-012), Board of Directors adopted the findings and approved the exemption to authorize the use of the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) alternative contracting method for Rock Creek Campus.

After a formal Request for Proposals process, per Resolution #12-065 on December 8, 2011, the Board awarded the Construction Manager/General Contractor contract for the Rock Creek Campus 2008 bond program to Fortis Construction, Inc., for an initial amount of \$500,000. Resolution 12- 110 authorized \$877,651 for the emergency generator work at Rock Creek, for a total authorization to date of \$1,377,651.

As part of the 2008 Bond Program, an approximately 28,000 square foot addition is planned for Building 7, to replace the existing "half-round" portions of the building on the east side. The College would like to proceed with the demolition of the areas to be removed, in order to take advantage of summer term to minimize campus impact, take advantage of better weather, and stay on schedule. The guaranteed maximum price (GMP) for the demolition of the east portion of Building 7 is \$_____.
Renovation of the Career Technical Education (CTE)

areas in Building 2 will also proceed this summer, with improvements to Auto Collision, Welding, Diesel, and Building Construction Technology (BCT). These improvements include mechanical, electrical, plumbing (MEP), an overhead storage addition, and upgrades to some existing classrooms. The guaranteed maximum price (GMP) for this phase of work in Building 2 is \$_____. The earlier authorizations plus the two authorizations requested in this resolution total \$_____.

Funding for the Buildings 7 and 2 work will come from the 2008 Bond Program.

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As part of the 2008 Bond Program, an approximately 28,000 square foot addition is planned for Building 7, to replace the existing "half-round" portions of the building on the east side. The College would like to proceed with the demolition of the areas to be removed, in order to take advantage of summer term to minimize campus impact, take advantage of better weather, and stay on schedule. The guaranteed maximum price (GMP) for the demolition of the east portion of Building 7 is \$1,708,321. Renovation of the Career Technical Education (CTE)

areas in Building 2 will also proceed this summer, with improvements to Auto Collision, Welding, Diesel, and Building Construction Technology (BCT). These improvements include mechanical, electrical, plumbing (MEP), an overhead storage addition, and upgrades to some existing classrooms. The guaranteed maximum price (GMP) for this phase of work in Building 2 is \$1,071,312. The earlier authorizations plus the two authorizations requested in this resolution total \$4,157,284.

Funding for the Building 7 and 2 work will come from the 2008 Bond Program.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Directors authorizes Fortis Construction, Inc. to complete the Building 7 demolition and Building 2 CTE renovation projects for the Rock Creek Campus. The GMP for these projects will be \$2,779,633. All expenditures for these services will be from the 2008 bond funds.

plans, district-wide interior standards development, and cost estimating services.

Authorization is needed to increase the contract amount to complete the Student Commons and other campus work. The total amount estimated to complete this work, which is the balance of the work for this campus, is \$1,514,760. The expected duration of this work will be approximately 12 months, through Spring 2013. The authorization provided by this Resolution and Resolutions #10-059 and #11-084 will total \$4,983,390.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Directors authorizes SRG Partnership Inc. to complete construction documents for the Student Commons for the Southeast Center 2008 bond program. The cost for these services will be approximately \$1,514,760 over the next 12 months. All expenditures for these services will be from 2008 bond funds.
