REPORT: The proposed Less Than One-Year Certificate in Police

Leadership covers the content outlined in Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 259-008-0025: Minimum Standards for Training (4), which requires all law

enforcement officers to satisfactorily complete the Middle Management training within one year of promotion. The

12-credit certificate exceeds the minimum content stipulated in the OAR. The certificate's development was

based on a request from several law enforcement

agencies in the area including Hillsboro Police Department; the Sheriff Departments of Washington,

Clackamas, and Multnomah Counties; and in consultation with an attorney who represents law enforcement agencies. The certificate content includes management and supervision strategies and critical thinking for informed decision-making for police leaders.

RECOMMENDATION: That the College be authorized to submit an application

to the Oregon State Board of Education for the Less Than One-Year Certificate in Police Leadership for

Portland Community College
