REPORT:	The proposed One-Year Certificate in Emergency Telecommunications/Service Dispatcher effectively separates the two aspects of what is currently the Emergency Telecommunicator/911 Dispatcher Certificate. This certificate prepares individuals to work in the field of telecommunications and dispatch services for any business or industry which employs dispatchers for scheduling and moving goods and services. The Emergency Telecommunications faculty worked closely with their advisory group to design this 50-credit certificate to meet a community need. The Emergency Telecommunications/Service Dispatcher certificate shares 60% of the coursework with the Emergency Telecommunication/911 Dispatcher program and provides a career option for students who are not ideal candidates to be a 911 Dispatcher.
RECOMMENDATION:	That the College be authorized to submit an application to the Oregon State Board of Education for the One-Year Certificate in Emergency Telecommunications/Service Dispatcher for Portland Community College.
