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REPORT: The proposed Wire and TIG Less Than One-Year Career

Pathway Certificate serves the local welding industry and is designed for employed individuals who want to develop

specific skills for specialization and increased

employability. This certificate allows students to focus their training in two commonly used process areas, wire and TIG. Both of these welding processes can require multiple certificates for the welder. The student needs indepth study and practice in the technical aspects of these

processes to meet workforce requirements. Upon

completion and certification, individuals will be prepared

to weld ferrous and non-ferrous metals such as

aluminum, magnesium and copper alloys. This is one of six specialized certificates in the Welding Department and prepares students for wire and TIG welding. Completion of this 44-credit certificate will provide a benchmark as students work toward their Welding AAS.
